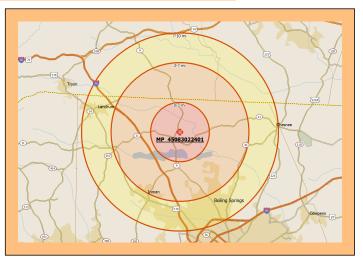

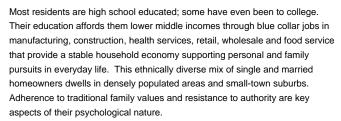

The adults are high school educated and work at blue-collar jobs in manufacturing, construction and transportation.
