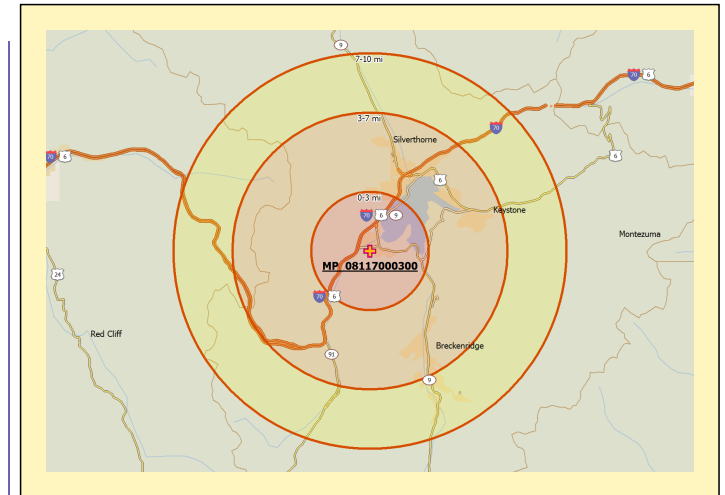
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Acts 10:9-10

Land, family and community are central to the day-to-day lives of the people. Young couples with pre-school children have turned New Suburbia Families into a booming lifestyle. Concentrated in fast-growing, metro fringe communities mainly in the West and Southwest, the segment's population has more than tripled since 1990. With many households under 35 years old, these young families are making the most of their new subdivisions. More than half the housing has a median value worth nearly 50 percent above the U.S. average.

Most of the adults live as couples or in households with few children.
