In their fast-growing cities- including a number of college towns-these upscale young people live in luxury apartments and condos, commuting to work in sporty subcompacts. Nearly half hold college degrees, and they are almost twice the average for grad degrees.

Affluent Urban Professionals

The yuppies of the last decade may have grown up, but their lifestyle lives on. In Affluent Urban Professionals, wealthy singles and couples live in the chic high-rise neighborhoods of many big cities such as New York, Boston and Chicago, owning swank condos and apartments valued at twice the national average.
